Elm Street Project

The Elm Street Project is in the works to replace a deteriorating section of the old stone wall. In addition, the section of aging water main on Elm Street will be replaced. This project is eligible for a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG); we are preparing an income survey for only the residents this project will impact. This project will improve surface water drainage and the replacement of the water main, will greatly improve water quality and pressure for homes in that area. Residents are encouraged to complete the survey as soon as possible as funding deadline is June 15 and we will need 100% response in order to be eligible for funding. Please Slow Down

A recent radar study conducted by NYS DOT revealed that 59% of traffic on Route 395/Main Street within the Village is exceeding the speed limit. NYS Police and Schenectady Sheriff patrols have bolstered their efforts and reports indicate that up to 10 tickets per day have been issued. The Village Planning Board is seeking Volunteers!

The Delanson Planning Board is comprised of 5 members. Members volunteer their time, in an effort, to preserve the historic significance, character and quality of your community. The Planning Board has the authority to approve subdivision of property, other development approvals and zoning cases within the Village.

Eligible members must be US Citizen; a Village resident; and at least 18 years of age. The Planning Board meets the first Monday of the month at 7pm at the Village Hall/Delanson Fire House. Planning Board members are required to obtain a minimum of 4 hours training within a 1-year period.

Surface Water Treatment Plant Upgrades

As residents are aware, our water system has struggled with violations of a drinking water standard over the years and most recently during the 4th quarter 2018 through 1st quarter of 2019. The Village Board takes this situation very seriously so in an effort to keep this from happening in the future, we are proposing to make upgrades to its Surface Water Treatment Plant, Water Distribution Infrastructure, and develop auxiliary water sources. The proposed improvements would be phased in over time allowing us to use funds appropriated from the Water Budget. The following improvements are proposed:

- 1. Surface Water Treatment
 Plant Clearwell Improvements:
 Improvements to the filtered
 water clearwell basins at the
 Village's Surface Water
 Treatment Plant (SWTP)
 include additional valving and
 bypass piping that will enable
 Operations staff to isolate each
 clearwell for operation and
 maintenance purposes. The
 proposed improvements will
 significantly improve the
 operational flexibility of the
 treatment plant.
- ~ Engineers Opinion of Cost = \$13,000

- 2. Surface Water Treatment Plant Finished Water Flow Meter and Meter Pit: The installation of a finished water flow meter and metering pit downstream on the SWTP will enable Operations staff to flow pace the injection of sodium hypochlorite required for disinfection of the filtered water prior to consumption by the community. This improvement will enable Operations staff to accurately monitor and control chemical injection and help mitigate the formation of Disinfection By-Products in the distribution system.
- ~ Engineers Opinion of Cost = \$16,000
- 3. Surface Water Treatment Plant Building Envelope Improvements: Improvements include the sealing of cracks and holes in the clearwell walls and ceilings, and the construction of new exterior wall sections to prevent rodent intrusion at the SWTP.
- ~ Engineers Opinion of Cost = \$32,000

- 4. Development of Additional Groundwater Sources: The Village, via the assistance of a Hydrogeologist, will evaluate the potential to develop an auxiliary groundwater supply to supplement its existing surface water reservoirs during seasonal dry periods. If suitable groundwater sources are identified, this task will include the development of a new groundwater production well and corresponding preliminary hydrogeologic testing for regulatory approval.
- ~ Engineers Opinion of Cost = \$33,000
- 5. Granular Activated Carbon Pilot Study: In the near future, the Village will need to evaluate the addition of Granular Activated Carbon Filters at its SWTP to remove the precursors of disinfection byproducts. The pilot study will entail the construction of a small scale granular activated carbon filter system that will be used to determine the effectiveness and maintenance costs associated with a full-scale system.
- ~ Engineers Opinion of Cost = \$6,000

Sally Wilber Memorial Trail

Access to the trail head is at the northeast corner of the building; where there is a sign for the Sally Wilber Trail. From there, follow the turkey tracks to a kiosk that has maps that guide you through just under a one-mile loop, featuring eleven educational stations. This trail does cross over the Normanskill creek so be aware of recent rain fall and possible high water.

The YMCA will monitor the creek and may close the trail if necessary. There is also an entrance to the trail off the sewer treatment plant (WWTF sign) on Cole Road.

This is a self-guided trail so please be careful and considerate. If you carry it in, please carry it out with you. The trail is pet friendly; dogs should be on a leash and please come prepared to clean up after them.
