- I spoke again with a chemist at slack chemical about the elevated iron and Manganese levels to see what he recommended to help remediate the situation.
- Received THM and HA5 results

- Request from Casey Leclair for all lab work from the water dept.

Wednesday September 13<sup>th</sup>

- Received a phone call from DEC wanting to come out and sample the upper and lower reservoir.
